HOLIDAY ANTARCTICA & PATAGONIA VOYAGE 2014

DAY 1 — VALPARAÍSO, CHILE

“Our Seabourn Quest set sail today from beautiful Valparaíso. With the ship terminal nestled below the veniculars hidden between the sprawling communities and busy streets, we waved goodbye to the major Chilean port as we prepare to embark on our Holiday Antarctic & Patagonia Expedition! We were welcomed on board with Seabourn courtesies and a glass of champagne to make us immediately feel right at home.”



DAY 3 — PUERTO MONTT, CHILE

“We woke sailing in Reloncaví Sound towards Puerto Montt, on almost glassy seas comfortably aboard Seabourn Quest, as the sun climbed into an almost clear sky to our port with snowcapped volcanic peaks in the distance and Puerto Montt ahead. Numerous fishermen tending their salmon farms were out on either side of the main channel leading into Puerto Montt with numerous brown hooded gulls opportunistically flying about. The scene was set for our day ashore.”



DAY 15 — HOPE BAY, ANTARCTICA

“Hope Bay is home to tens of thousands of Adélie penguins. Adélie penguins, named for the wife of the French explorer Dumont d’Urville, are everyone’s idea of the prototypical penguin. We spent about an hour watching the little white-breasted, black-backed, white-eyed creatures come down to the water, gather in groups to jump in and then return by popping out of the water one-by-one.”



DAY 19 — GRYTVIKEN, SOUTH GEORGIA ISLAND

“As the Zodiac approached the landing beach, everyone could first see the tall, craggy and ice-covered mountains which give this extraordinary island one of its nicknames as ‘The Alps of the South Atlantic’. Even closer to shore, everyone could also observe the vast numbers of animals that crowd South Georgia Island, making it one of the true biological wonders of the world.”

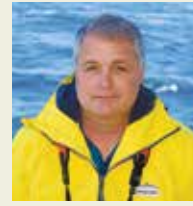
Dr. Catherine Hickson

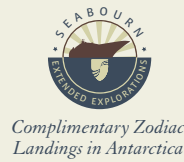

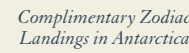

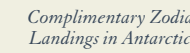
